# Baptism of the Lord

## From the Pastor's Desk...

**My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**  
Praised Be Jesus Christ...  
Greetings from Blessed Mother!!!

### **Baptism of Our Lord...**

This Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of Our Lord. This is a wonderful opportunity to take an accounting of all of the Blessings God has bestowed upon us. It also gives us the opportunity to see how we are using those blessings for love of God and neighbor.

As we begin the new year, it is common to look back over the past year to see how we've done, where we want to go and things we need to work on. With the economy in the news so much these days (and in the closing months of 2009) we need to look at our own finances to see how we're doing. In this area we have some good news and some "not so good news." The good news is that our Sunday collections finished \$35,494 ahead of what we had budgeted. The "not so good news" is that the overall budget finished roughly \$155,000 dollars in the red. (that's bad) This means we had about \$155,000 more expenses than income. (that's bad too)

As we are preparing the budget for 2010, I have asked the Finance Council to help prepare a balanced budget. This means that our projected income will match our projected expenses. This is going to be a challenge because expenses are rising but we are trying to be good stewards of the resources that have been entrusted to us.

We will also be initiating an increased offertory campaign to help raise collections which will help off-set expenses that are outside of our control. Over the course of the next couple weeks, I will be contacting you personally by mail asking for your assistance. Please pray about this appeal and what you can do to help. It might be helpful to know that every priest in the Lafayette Diocese (myself included) will be taking a 1.4% cut in pay. Even in light of this, I plan to increase my Sunday giving because I know how important this is to our Parish. If everyone is able to do something then we can overcome the financial crisis that we are facing.

The goal of this Stewardship Appeal is three-fold:

1. encourage all parishioners to use the envelope system regularly.
2. To introduce and reaffirm the concepts of Christian stewardship
3. To request a slight weekly increase in the offering by all members of the parish.

We hope that all who are able to make a modest financial increase on the part of the parish will respond in the next week or two. Thank you!

May our heavenly Father bless and guide you.

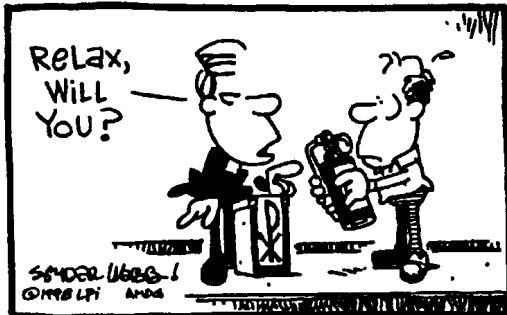

### **Focus on Ministry ... Ministers of Communion**

*Any parishioner that has been fully initiated into the Church (i.e., Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation) may serve in this ministry. Ministers of Communion must have a deep love and commitment to Christ in the Eucharist. They are humble in their service to the assembly and may also assist in bringing Communion to the homebound and shut-ins. Ministers are trained annually and officially commissioned on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.*

### **Ask Father?**

*(Many people have asked me questions about the Faith or why we do what we do. If you have questions you would like answered please drop me a note and I would be happy to respond to them.)*

### **Q.: How long is the Christmas Season?**

**A.: The Christmas Season begins on Christmas Day (Dec. 25th) and runs through The Baptism of Our Lord (this is the Sunday after the Epiphany).**

This year it is January 10th, 2010. The Christmas Season is the celebration of Jesus' birth and epiphany (manifestation). It is second in significance only to the Easter Season. (The Catholic Source Book, 333)

### **It's Feasts include:**

1. Christmas (December 25th)
2. Holy Family (The Sunday after Christmas)
3. Mary, Mother of God (January 1st)
4. Epiphany (The Sunday after January 1st)
5. Baptism of our Lord (The Sunday after Epiphany)

There are two things that are guaranteed for a person who graduates from The Woods. We can quote St. Mother Theodore Guerin, "and rest assured, my dear daughters, if you lean with all your weight upon Providence, you will find yourselves well supported," and Robert Frost:

### *The Road Not Taken* by Robert Frost

*Two roads diverged in a yellow wood,  
And sorry I could not travel both  
And be one traveler, long I stood  
And looked down one as far as I could  
To where it bent in the undergrowth;*

*Then took the other, as just as fair,  
And having perhaps the better claim,  
Because it was grassy and wanted wear;  
Though as for that the passing there  
Had worn them really about the same,*

*And both that morning equally lay  
In leaves no step had trodden black.  
Oh, I kept the first for another day!  
Yet knowing how way leads on to way,  
I doubted if I should ever come back.*

*I shall be telling this with a sigh  
Somewhere ages and ages hence:  
Two roads diverged in a wood, and I—  
I took the one less traveled by,  
And that has made all the difference.*

I will admit that I can no longer quote the entire poem from memory but St. Mother Theodore Guerin and The Road Not Taken are reminders, especially on this very snowy day that through God, all things are possible. Sometimes the gifts and challenges we are given that seem out of the blue, different or contrary to that which were expecting make all the difference in our lives. We need only trust that God knows what is best and that if we rely on His strength, we will be all the better for it.

Dear Parishioners of Saint Mary,

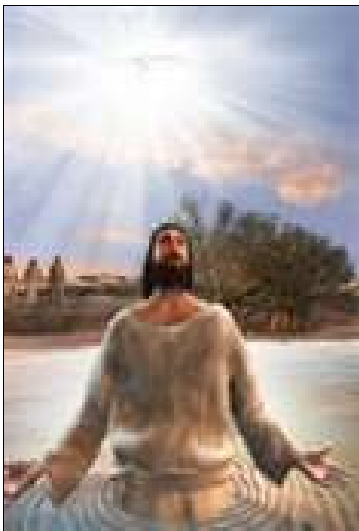
