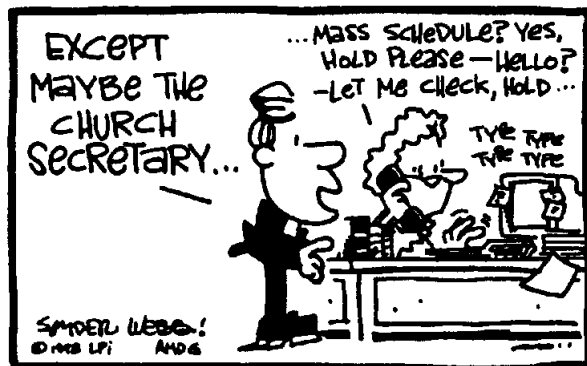

## *In the Scriptures...*

*The US bishop's pastoral on stewardship reinforces today's reading from I Corinthians: "Because its individual members do collectively make up the Body of Christ, that body's health and well-being are the responsibility of the members—the personal responsibility of each one of us. We all are stewards of the Church."*

## **Focus on Ministry ... Homebound/Hospital Ministry**

*This ministry is open to all Ministers of Communion who would like to visit and bring the Eucharist to parishioners who are homebound or in the hospital. If you are not currently a Minister of Communion and would be interested in being one for this ministry, contact Deacon Gary. This caring ministry brings comfort and strength to our members who are isolated from us because of injury or illness. Training is conducted throughout the year as the need arises.*

### **IT TAKES A LIFETIME TO RAISE A STEWARD**

Generations of faith filled Catholic people have passed on to us the most precious gift that we possess — the gift of faith. As this generation's "good stewards", we are obligated to pass on the gift of faith to our children.

Children primarily learn through the examples of their parents. ## **Ask Father?**

*(Many people have asked me questions about the Faith or why we do what we do. If you have questions you would like answered please drop me a note and I would be happy to respond to them.)*

### **Q.: When are we going to be able to start receiving the Precious Blood again?**

**A.:** Bishop Higi is the one who has mandated the suspension of the Precious Blood at all of the Masses so we are not able to start offering the Precious Blood until we receive his permission. Having said that, Bishop Higi is planning on lifting the suspension at midnight on February 18th at midnight. This is assuming that there is not another H1N1 flu outbreak or threat of one (or something similar).

Even after February 18th, everyone is asked to use prudential judgment when receiving the Precious Blood, offering the sign of peace or using the Holy Water. If you are sick please refrain from all of the above. When you receive the Host you are receiving Jesus fully—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.
